Early Learning Goals (ELGs)

Linked to Curriculum Guidance for EYFS

The fundamental goal of the ‘Under the sea’ session is to give children (and their parents, teachers and carers) an inspirational first experience of visiting a very special museum. Through hands on discovery, imagination and role play, we hope to empower children with the excitement, confidence and skills to begin a life-long enjoyment of museums.

Communication and language development

- Giving children opportunities to speak and listen in a range of situations
- Develop their confidence and skills in expressing themselves

Physical development

- Providing opportunities for young children to be active and interactive
- Develop their co-ordination, control, and movement

Personal, social and emotional development

- Helping children to develop a positive sense of themselves and others
- Form positive relationships and develop respect for others
- Develop social skills and learn how to manage their feelings
- Understand appropriate behaviour in groups
- Have confidence in their own abilities

Understanding of the world

- Guiding children to make sense of their physical world and their community through opportunities to explore, observe and find out about people, places, technology and the environment.

Expressive arts and design

- Supporting children to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials
- Providing opportunities and encouragement for sharing their thoughts, ideas and feelings through a variety of activities in art, music, movement, dance, role play, and design and technology
